
Miss Moore is so sure of herself, in fact, that she's not afraid of any-















their forebears did, and to be with them is like taking a trip back into the past. I love their speech. It's sensual and melodic, like the sound of music."

Stacey is now modeling in California and hopes to break into TV commercials. But she's well aware that it's an insecure profession, and Stacey's a born Sybarite. "I love















Sheer Delight

men. "I like very thin, tall men.






