





### DOMINANT TRAITS










"If you want to play my game," she insists, "you follow my rules. But if you're a really good competitor, there's a chance I can be subdued."




"You're always invited to come out of the winter's chill and tag along," says Dominique. "As long as you're willing to follow my lead, we'll heat up the night together."








# INTO THE WOODS

"I think I know why you're blocked," Lynn whispered to her leading man. "You've got to relax.... Pretend I'm your reallife lover and act naturally...."



















