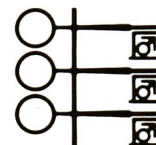

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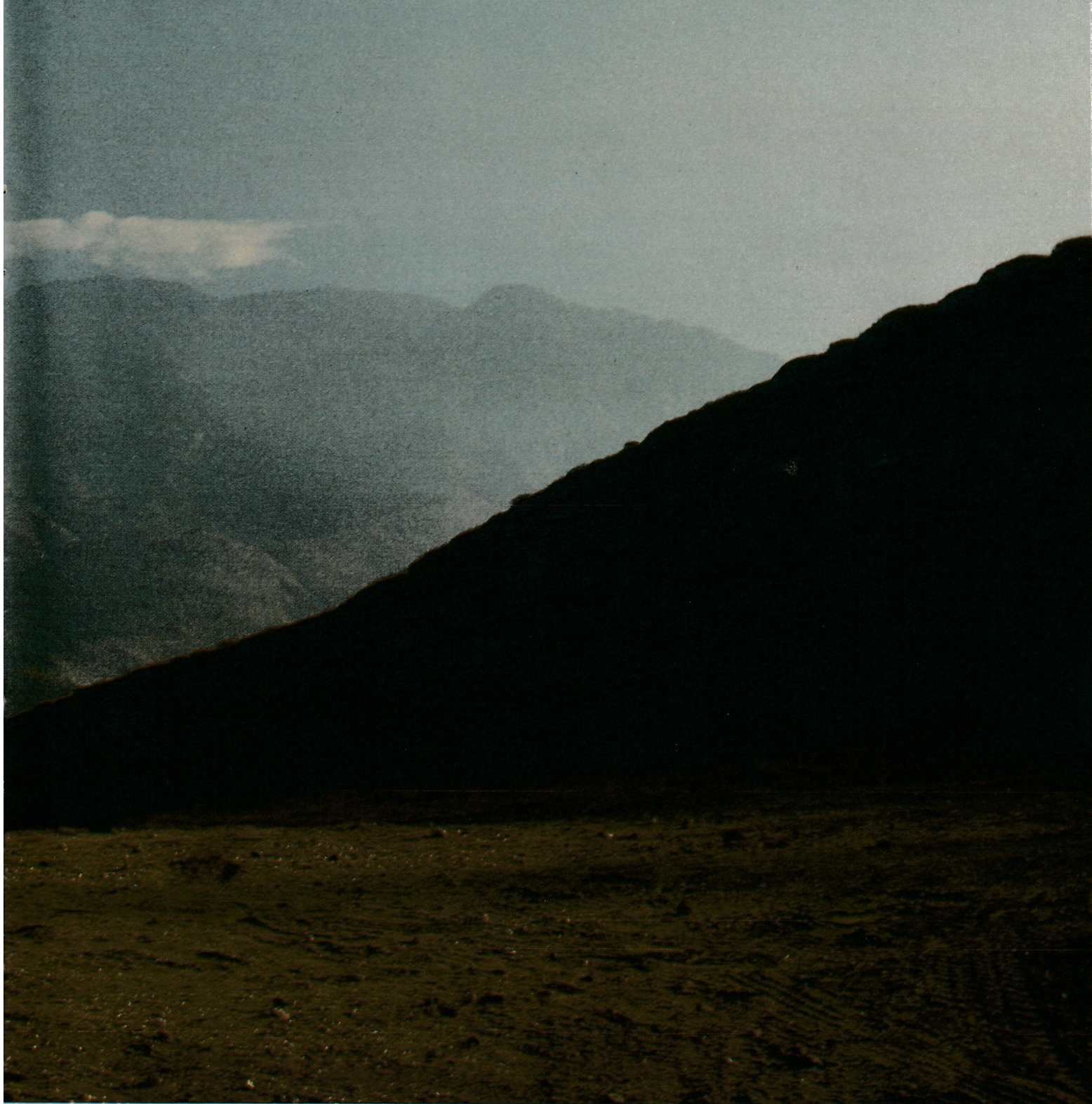
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SKEETER

"I like the character Glenn Close played in *Fatal Attraction*," Justine says with a mischievous giggle. "Now *there's* a woman who really went with her emotions!"



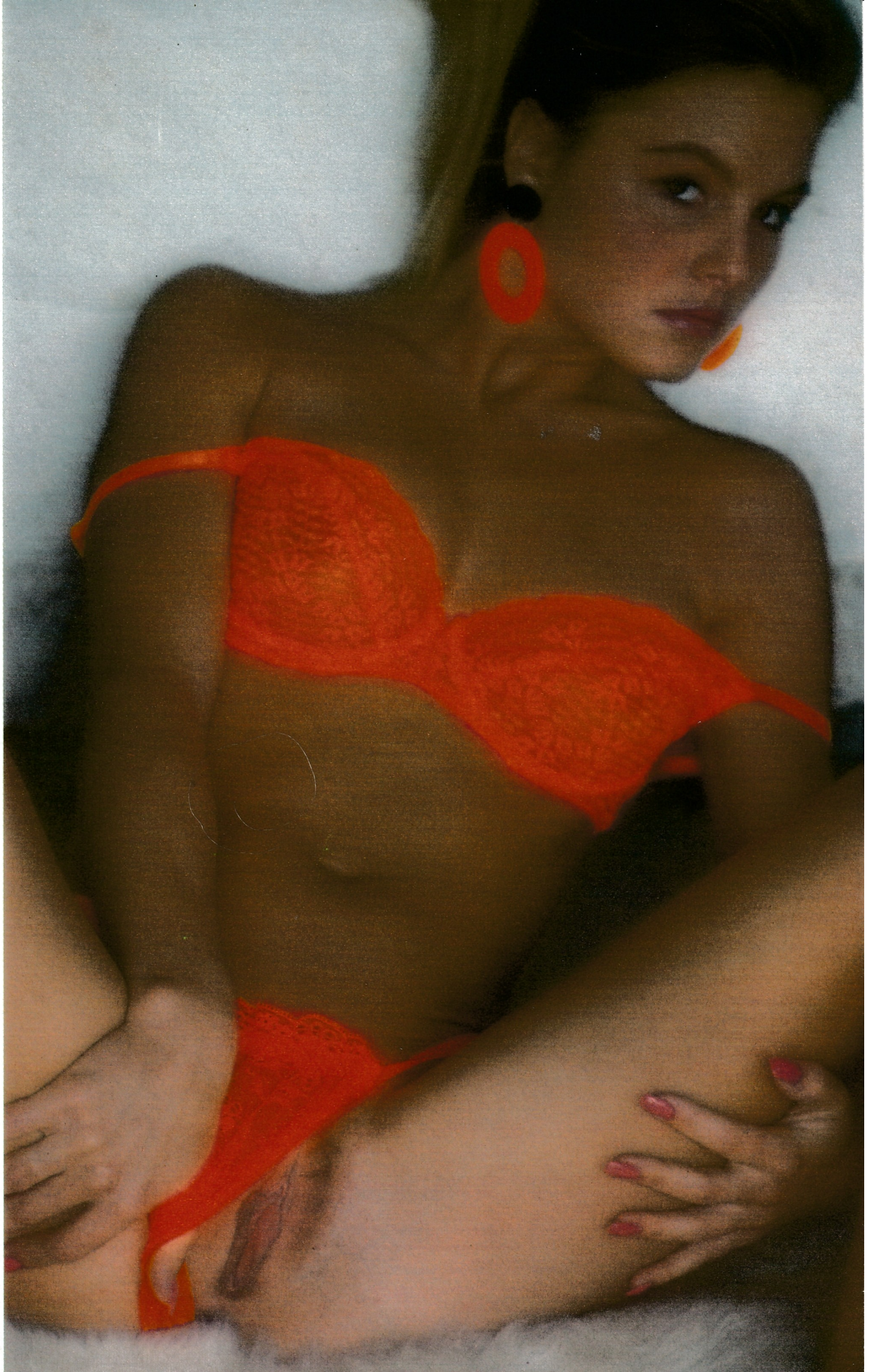



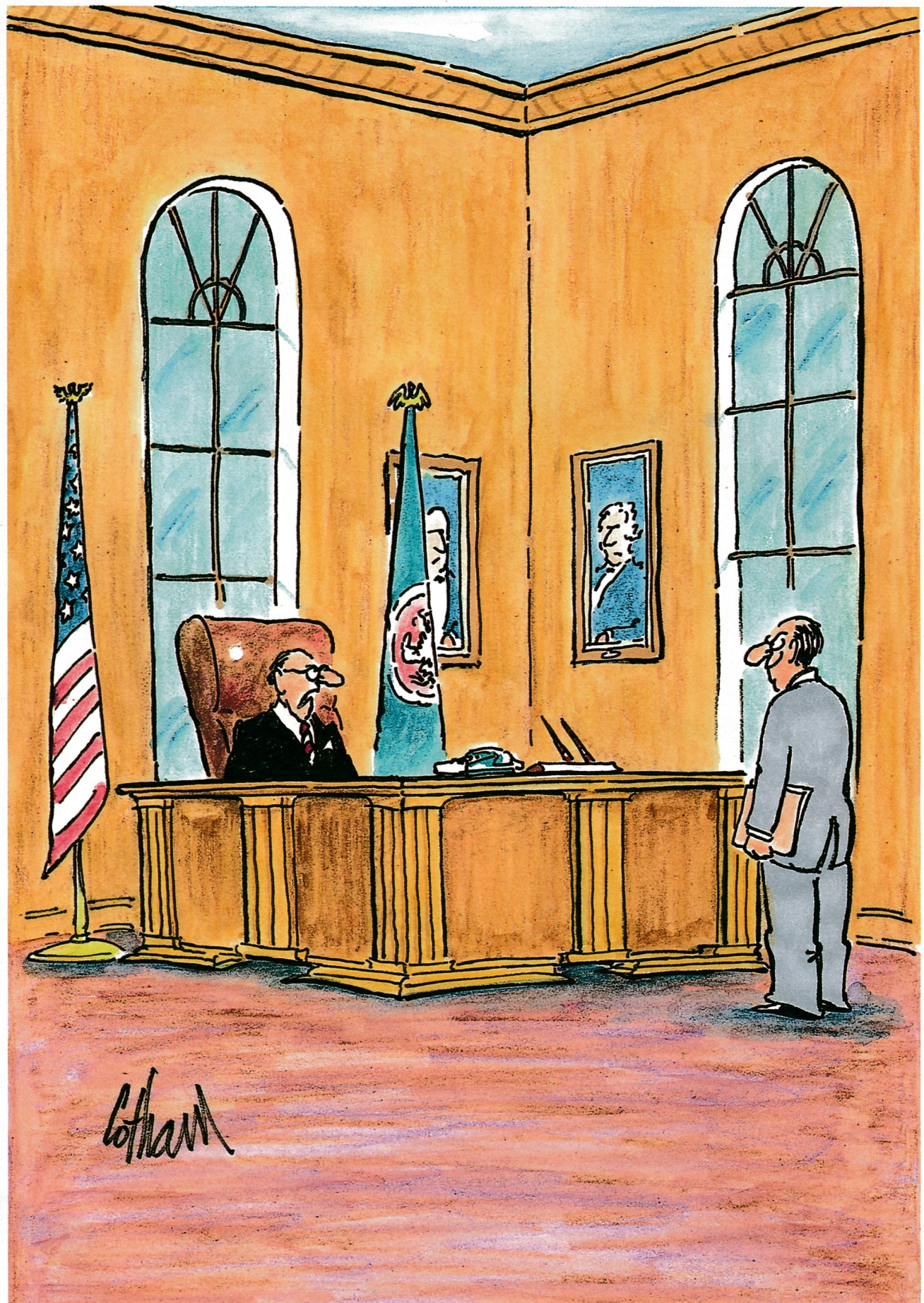
