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























ARCHIE GOODWIN 1938-1998

On March 1st, one of the last truly great members of the comics establishment passed away. Archie Goodwin had been fighting cancer for 8 years, which is more than half the time I knew him. I have never known anyone, absolutely anyone in my life who had fewer enemies than him. Not a one in fact. And as Denny O'Neil put so well in his eulogy at the memorial, purely the fact he was an editor means someone is gonna hate you. I knew other editors who bitched about him, but they didn't hate him. No one could. He was such a genuinely nice guy. In the comics industry, if you are a writer, you will probably hold someone like Alan Moore, Stan Lee, Garth Ennis, Peter David or Alan Davis in awe. If you are an artist, it will probably be someone like Jack Kirby, Adam Hughes, Alan Davis, Neal Adams or Kevin Nowlan. If you are an editor there was only really Archie Goodwin or Julie Schwartz. Julie retired actively from the industry many years ago. That left one. Archie went right on editing and writing. Heck. If you pushed him, he drew too. If you have no idea who I'm talking about, he has edited and written for Marvel, DC and Warren (-who published EERIE, CREEPY, BLAZING COMBAT and VAM-PIRELLA). His last post was at DC Comics, editing Legends Of The Dark Knight and several of their special projects. He will be sorely missed and impossible to replace. Another light in the house of ideas has been extinguished making it the darker for us all.

Archie was one of those strange people who really could do it all. I found him to be extraordinarily generous to a young stat camera operator who he kidded with and made feel an important part of comics. Now, that very important part of comics has been taken from us and all we have left are memories of him and his work. And what work, his early Warren stuff proved him to be prodigious and among his accomplishments at Marvel were little things like Editor in Chief, an 8-year stint on Iron Man and running Epic Magazine. His Star Wars strip work with Al Williamson was so defining, that his SW movie adaptations were a natural and enjoyed by Lucas himself. He relished and made us all laugh at the grinding schedule of newspaper strip writing and we all laughed at Al's and Gil ("StarHawks") Kane's expense. My memory of him is of the driest-humored man I'd ever worked with. His calm and courage and self-deprecating humor in the face of what was a relentless cancer makes him one of the bravest people I've ever met. Yep, he could do it all. It hurts to know he's gone.

Dear Friends.

We are struggling to help our staggering brother, the Penthouse Website, to stand erect. Right now, we wish to encourage you all to email as well as (oh, how quaint!) write us. We need to know how we are doing in your eyes and we read everything.

In the meantime, many of your emails are concerning submission guidelines, subscriptions and back issues. Subs and back ishs are dealt with by a usually snappily efficient company who is listed in the front section of every book. They respond like mad ferrets to every little problem, unlike us, who respond with a rapidly opening eyelid. As far as submission guidelines- there are NONE! Pros make an art sub look like a comic page, writers put down any gobbledygook. Amateurs, on the other hand, must think clearly and write deliberately (send character concepts and spring boards for storylines- no full scripts, please), artists must know which craft they can do: pencil or ink. Those who can do both know not to do lettering or coloring. And DON'T SEND ORIGINALS! For comic art, send 64% reduced copies of pencils or inks. For large pieces of art, send slides or 4x5 chromes.

But be most careful in expectations. The work we use is not just top-notch but is already a heady mix of the greatest and near-greatest. Yes, we use a smattering of our friends, but guys and gals, we're all blooded comic vets, our "pals" are the greatest and near-greatest. Bear in mind that we generally use single creators, who do all the functions. Finally, we really, really read and look at everything. But, we can't reply to everyone, even guys whose work has appeared in comics. And we will not send anyone's stuff back, if you include a SASE, we may not even send a reply in it. Why? Because it's too much! We only have a few pages to experiment with each month, and only so much of a budget. So there, but we do need to hear from you as readers.

LARA GROFT should be the action figure media event of the season.

One of the most successful games in recent years gets her own figure line and she's a babe, so that's one over Duke Nuke'em for a start.

Well apart from her obvious weapons (nyuck, nyuck), she comes armed with Barretta, Uzi (her weapon of choice), Street Sweeper and M-16 automatic. She gets to use these against an Atlantean guard and an "evil bat" also included.

Okay, okay. You wanna know what the figure looks like, I know, I know. I must admit to being a little disappointed. I mean I'm no great fan of the game. In fact I've never played it. But from all the fuss that was made I was expecting something a little more. I shouldn't have. With the

The X-MEN are and have been pretty hot since Jack Kirby first created them (his artwork from the first seven issues adorns the box) back in 1963. But they have almost been the mainstay of Marvel Comics since 1975 when they were revamped by Len Wein and Dave Cockrum, then Chris Claremont and John Byrne produced a run of X-Men that still has fans talking to this day.



How do the figures measure up?

Pretty damn well. Kirby's art on the box pulls you in from the start. The box also gives you information on all five of the characters. We wasted no time in getting them out of the box.

The Good-

Cyclops: Has liftable visor and red glowing eyes. Looks cool.

Iceman: Nice painting and good poseability.

Beast: Again, pretty good poseability. Has ankle movements, like the others, which make for some good recreations of old Hank poses.

Angel: Probably the best sculpted and jointed figure of the bunch, even without his wings.

Marvel Girl: The Lara Croft that should have been. Reasonably good jointwork, good sculpting and love that pony tail.

The Bad-

The figures, like most these days, always seem most comfortable in one position. We couldn't get the snowballs out of Iceman's hands and why didn't they go for the real snowman look he had in the early issues? Because if you're gonna do that, you could have put Marvel girl in the headpiece she got in issue 6 (I suppose her later costume with the miniskirt will come in a later set).

The Ugly-


